NORMAN WINTER, Extension Horticulturist with Mississippi State University Extension Service, is the author of three gardening books. He enjoys working with homeowners and home gardeners alike.

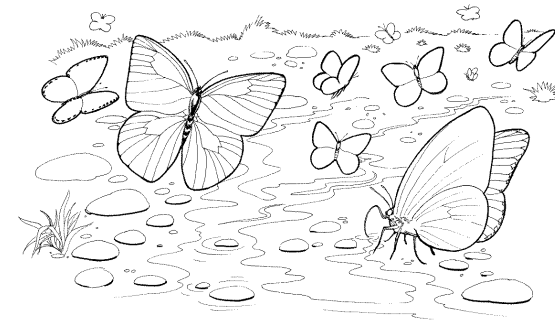

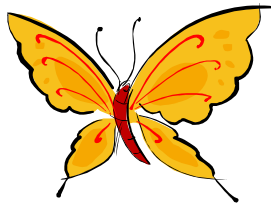

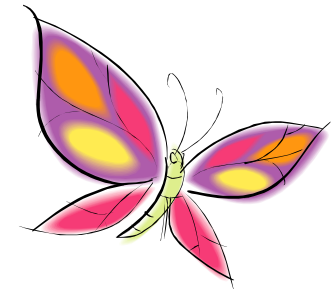
